# DAY 3 CONDITIONAL SENTENCES OVERVIEW AND PROPER USE

3 Scenario: Your team is discussing what would happen if the company introduced a 4-day workweek. (Second conditional)

a) If the company introduced a 4-day workweek, employee satisfaction would likely increase.

b) Were the company to implement a 4-day workweek, productivity might improve.

c) If we had a 4-day workweek, work-life balance would be much better.

4 Scenario: Your company's sales would have been higher if the product had been marketed differently. (Mixed conditional)

a) If we had marketed the product differently, our sales would be higher now.

b) Had the product been marketed more effectively, we would have higher sales today.

c) If the marketing strategy had been better, current sales figures would reflect greater success.
